<i>juz'</i> (pl. <i>ajzâ'</i> )	جُزْءٌ	a section of the Qur'an equal to one-thirtieth of the text
Kaaba ( <i>Ka'bah</i> )	الكَعْبَةِ	the House of Allah in Makkah, originally built by Prophets Ibrâheem and Ismâ'eel, which Muslims face when they pray
<i>khuṭbah</i>	خُطْبَةٌ	sermon or speech; specifically, the sermon given during the Friday congregational prayer
<i>Laylat al-Qadr</i>	لَيْلَةُ الْقَدْرِ	the 'Night of Destiny' or 'Night of Power' on which the Qur'an was first revealed; the most blessed night of the year, which is better than a thousand months; Muslims look for it on the odd nights during the last ten days of Ramadan and are supposed to spend those nights in prayer and supplication, reciting Qur'an and seeking Allah's forgiveness
<i>maḥram</i>	مَحْرَمٌ	a degree of consanguinity precluding marriage; a man whom a woman may not marry due to the close blood or marriage relationship, e.g., her father, brother, son, uncle, or father-in-law
<i>makrooh</i>	مَكْرُوهٌ	disliked
manna	مَنَّ	a sweet, nutritious food that Allah (ﷻ) sent to the children of Israel when they were wandering in the desert
